The ISZN Learning Path

From Foundations to Qualifications

Little Ibex (Nursery)

Our nursery students thrive in the warmth and welcome of this environment. A combination of structured activity and free play allow them to develop crucial skills and the dual language approach fosters language development.



Early Years (Pre-K - KG1)

The ISZN Early Years programme builds strong foundations for the journey ahead, preparing children for a smooth transition into Primary. Care is offered from 3 months, with dual-language immersion, early literacy and numeracy, and a nurturing international community.



Primary School (KG2- Grade 5)

The incorporation of the academic rigour of the British curriculum within our skills-based framework of instruction ensures that our Primary students have sound academic foundations and are active participants in their lifelong journey of learning.



Lower Secondary (Grades 6-8)

The Lower Secondary programme continues to embed the enquiry skills developed in Primary and creates a seamless transition into the higher level of academic rigour found in the Secondary British curriculum, ensuring strong foundations in all subject areas as students prepare for their examination years.



IGCSEs (Grades 9-10)

Students studying for their IGCSEs will continue their focus on core subjects, but also have the opportunity to choose subjects that interest them as they begin to determine their path forward to tertiary education.



A-Levels (Grades 11-12)

Cambridge and Edexcel International A-Levels are internationally recognised and highly regarded around the world. The syllabuses develop a deep understanding of subjects and form the foundation for university entrance.



Graduation & Beyond

ISZN graduates have the tools at their fingertips to access a tertiary education in Switzerland and internationally, with the IGCSE and A-Level programme considered a gold standard for university access.



Early Years



Early Years education takes place from the ages of 3 months to 5 years and consists of Nursery, Pre-Kindergarten and 1st Kindergarten. During this period, we lay the foundations for the journey ahead, preparing children for a happy and successful progression towards the next stage of their education.

In these classes, we introduce children to the fascinating world of learning in a happy, caring and supportive environment. The teaching space is tailored to the needs of the children; open, play-based learning and a range of flexible seating in all classrooms allows us to adapt our teaching facilities in a way that best suits the subject and lesson. Our youngest students are also exposed to foundational literacy and numeracy skills in a fun and engaging environment that allows them to engage with core skills at an age-appropriate level.

ISZN Dual Language Programme

Enabling your child to thrive in a globalised world

Our Dual Language Programme is offered in the Early Years, from Nursery through Kindergarten 1. Children build a strong foundation in both English and German, developing confidence and adaptability from the very start of their learning journey. This bilingual beginning supports not only language development but also cultural awareness, preparing young learners to thrive as they move forward into our international curriculum.



Primary School

Throughout the Primary School we follow the globally renowned, British Curriculum, which ensures academic rigour within our skills-based framework of instruction.

This curriculum framework focuses on the development of the whole child as an enquirer, harnessing their natural curiosity and creativity. This extends beyond the school walls and provides a well-rounded, challenging, and meaningful education for all students, regardless of their background. The six principal subject areas are Language, Social Studies, Mathematics, Science, the Arts and Personal, Social & Physical Education. Increased academic rigour in Mathematics and Literacy is provided through the British White Rose Math and Read, Write Inc. programmes which allow for clear classroom differentiation in these key areas and data-based feedback on individual student progress. A rigorous and well-implemented German curriculum complements our wider learning provision, ensuring every student develops valuable language skills.



Lower Secondary

Our Lower Secondary Programme offers students an enriching curriculum designed to lay an excellent foundation for their IGCSE studies and beyond. Pupils benefit from a wide range of core and extended subjects, with a strong emphasis on Mathematics, Science, Languages, and Humanities. In addition, our curriculum nurtures creativity and personal growth through PSHE, Physical Education, and the Arts — including visual art, drama, and music.

Students are encouraged to become independent, inquisitive learners through our Grade Challenge Programmes, which develop vital research and critical-thinking skills. High-quality teaching and learning are the hallmarks of this phase, ensuring every student is inspired and supported to reach their full potential.

During these years, students have the opportunity to take part in the prestigious Duke of Edinburgh's Award, gaining invaluable experiences in resilience, teamwork, and leadership - qualities that prepare them for success in school and in life.





IGCSE Years

A strong, flexible foundation for A-Levels and future university pathways.

Our iGCSE programme follows a broad and balanced British curriculum, building secure academic foundations while giving students the flexibility to pursue individual interests and future goals.

Students typically study 6–9 iGCSE subjects, combining key academic areas with additional options that reflect strengths and aspirations. Subject choices are guided carefully, with clear input from teachers and academic leaders, so each student follows a programme that is both ambitious and well-matched.

Entry from other school systems: The full iGCSE programme is a natural fit for students entering Grade 9 (typically age 14), whether they are joining from an international school or a local system. Students transitioning from Swiss cantonal pathways or other international curricula can complete the full iGCSE route and progress onwards with A-Levels to Swiss and international universities, depending on graduation outcomes.

Progress is monitored consistently, and structured academic support sits alongside strong pastoral care. The iGCSE years also develop study habits that support success at A-Level and beyond, including organisation, critical thinking, and confident communication.

A-Levels

Deep specialisation with the guidance students need for confident university progression.



In Grades 11 and 12, students focus their learning and build a profile that supports university entry in Switzerland and internationally. Students select three A-Level subjects for specialisation, leading to examinations at the end of Grade 12, supported by expert teaching and structured feedback..

A-Level subjects span established disciplines such as Mathematics, the Sciences, and Languages, alongside options including Economics, Computer Science, and the Arts. Students may also choose to complete the Independent Project Qualification (IPQ) after Grade 11, strengthening research, analysis, and academic writing in an area of personal interest.

Entry from other school systems: The two-year A-Level programme is for students entering Grade 11 with a strong academic base and readiness to specialise. University pathways depend on prior coursework..

Throughout Upper Secondary, students benefit from pastoral care as well as careers and university guidance—supporting subject planning, pathway decisions, and well-prepared applications.

Accelerated Pathway

A focused three-year route to A-Levels for students joining later in secondary school.



The Accelerated Pathway is designed for students who enter in Grade 10 and want a clear, supported route to A-Levels in three years. Students complete an intensive iGCSE year in Grade 10, typically taking 6 iGCSEs, to build the subject readiness and academic habits needed for success in Grades 11 and 12.

Entry from other school systems: This pathway is ideal for students entering Grade 10, including those transferring directly after Sek 3 in the local school system, or for students aiming for the Swiss university pathway without previous iGCSE coursework. It provides a structured transition into Upper Secondary while building the academic readiness needed for A-Levels.

From the start, students receive careful guidance on subject choices and pathway planning, shaped by prior curriculum experience and university goals. Progress is closely monitored, with targeted academic support and pastoral care to help students manage pace and workload.

The result is a structured three-year pathway that supports motivated students to reach strong A-Level outcomes and progress towards Swiss universities, international destinations, or options across both.

High Quality Teaching & Learning at ISZN

At ISZN, our learning experiences are designed to help our students to thrive in a rapidly evolving world. High-Quality Teaching and Learning at ISZN is a learner-centered approach that supports the acquisition of knowledge, skills and values through purposeful communication, collaboration, and positive learning environments.

It involves clear and modelled expectations, culturally responsive practices, and a focus on understanding, application, and transfer of knowledge. Reflection and goal-directed practices are essential components, as is the provision of frequent, actionable feedback.

By building connections to other disciplines and global contexts, learning at ISZN empowers students to become motivated, engaged, and globally minded learners. Aligned with ISZN's core values of kindness, respect, and resilience, our teaching practices foster a supportive and inclusive community where all learners feel valued and empowered. At ISZN our high-quality teaching and learning is framed by the following themes:

- **Content:** Excellent subject knowledge is used to plan and deliver learning experiences with value, relevance and benefit to students.
- **Clarity:** Learning experiences have clear purpose and steps to success.
- **Support and Challenge:** All students are supported and challenged so that they achieve, attain and thrive.
- **Assessment:** Assessment approaches are used to monitor and support student progress.
- **Cognitive Engagement:** Learning experiences encourage deep cognitive engagement and student investment in learning.
- **Collaboration:** Students collectively shape learning experiences, by sharing their knowledge, ideas and perspectives.
- **Enjoyment:** Students are happy and enthusiastic about learning because they enjoy their experiences.
- **Classroom Culture:** Students feel nurtured and ready to learn.

Wellbeing & Belonging

The wellbeing of our students is at the heart of everything we do.

At ISZN we have a very strong pastoral system in place to ensure that we identify any hurdles in our students' lives at an early stage.

Every staff member is involved in making sure that our students feel safe and always know who to talk to if they want to share their feelings with someone or receive support in the classroom or in general. Regular wellbeing check-ins provide valuable insights in how our students are feeling and managing their feelings, outside of their academic performance.

The academic progress of each of our students is monitored, measured, and evaluated on a regular basis in an age-appropriate way. This allows our teachers to differentiate the learning in the classroom and our learning support team to intervene in a timely manner when a student requires additional support or an alternative approach to boost their learning. This could be by scaffolding their learning or stretching and challenging them, targeting the area of need and building on each student's strengths to enhance their learning experience.

Safeguarding at ISZN

Our safeguarding team, along with all teachers and staff members at ISZN, is dedicated to ensuring that the safeguarding of our students is a priority, and that all students have access to the support they need to thrive.

Safeguarding means:

- Protecting children from maltreatment;
- Preventing impairment of children's health or development;
- Ensuring that children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care; and
- Taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes

Co-Curricular Programmes

ISZN offers a broad range of activities to ensure pupils of all ages are able to find something which stimulates and inspires them.

Our Programme of Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs) consists of a plethora of after school clubs, all planned to complement and extend the students' learning or personal and emotional wellbeing. Recently offered CCAs include: Ballet, Basketball, Choir, Cricket, Graphic Design, Forensic Club, Yoga and many more besides. Alongside their weekly CCAs, students from Grade 1 upwards participate in an annual 'Camp Week'. The destination of Camp Week varies according to the age of the student, however, all have in common the opportunity to learn more about the natural environment, different cultures, and key life skills.

Throughout the year, children also have the opportunity to participate in a range of events organised by Cognita which span countries, and often continents. For example, the 'Story around the World' initiative has seen ISZN pupils creating illustrations for a published storybook produced by pupils from Cognita schools in Europe, Asia and South America.

The ISZN Ibex, our sports teams, regularly compete with other international schools all over Switzerland in various disciplines.




